



Dr Mike Sparrow has a PhD in Physical (Southern Ocean) Oceanography, a Masters degree in Atmospheric Sciences and a Bachelors in Physics. For the last six years he has been based at the National Oceanography Centre, Southampton, working for the Climate Variability and Predictability (CLIVAR) project of the World Climate Research Programme, where he has been responsible for coordinating CLIVAR's interests in the Southern Ocean and Antarctic region as well as in Africa.
